Preserving a Home for the Arts: A Second Century in These Walls



THE NEED

- The building that houses the Suffolk Center for Cultural Arts is 100 years old and has experienced significant water damage due to serious leaks.
 Parts of the building are unusable, and there are growing safety concerns. Extensive repairs are needed if the building is to remain in use.
- Sound and lighting systems in the magnificent Birdsong Theater and in the ballroom are obsolete and replacement parts are no longer available.



- Theater seats do not comfortably accommodate guests of all abilities and sizes.
- The pergola over our brick walkway needs to be covered to protect guests in inclement weather.








THE SOLUTION

- All of the windows across the building will be replaced, along with flashing and steel lintels.
- Crumbling ceiling and wall plaster will be repaired and insulation added to the walls.
- The building will be sealed with a Tnemec coating, a high-performance sealant that will prevent exterior water from penetrating the building while allowing interior water vapor to pass through the coating.



- New sound and lighting systems will be installed in the theater and ballroom.
- A section of theater seats will be replaced to create more accessible seating for guests of all abilities and sizes.
- A cover will be constructed for the pergola, and the walkway will be regraded to prevent flooding.

THE CHALLENGE

- Costs of the renovations and upgrades are outside the scope of our annual budget.
- \$4.5 million dollars is needed to cover the costs. It

IMPACT

- Each year approximately 30,000 people participate in arts-related and community events at the Suffolk Center or through our numerous outreach efforts.
- A myriad of classes and workshops provide the opportunity to discover the uplifting power of artistic expression.
- We partner with local public and private schools and homeschooling families to bring arts education to young people.
- Lasting memories are made at the Suffolk Center as our beautiful spaces host meetings, conferences, performances, recitals, art exhibitions, weddings, banquets, and class reunions.


